Father George Zahn - Celebrating Fifty Years of Priesthood

Father George credits his parents and grandparents for giving him a solid Catholic foundation which led to his vocation to become a priest. As the oldest of six children, he observed that his parents took an active part in their parishes in Maryland and Washington, D.C. They frequently invited their parish priests to their homes and one priest in particular who had an influence on Father George was Bishop John Russell. Father George said "of the six children I had an inclination to the priesthood since grade school. The vocation which I attribute to the Lord started in our home, our family. It was living in a family where prayer was very much a part of our life."

During the months of May and October after supper, the Zahn family would pray the rosary kneeling in the living room which had a shrine to the Blessed Mother. The family was very close and always active in their parish.

The Sisters of Saint Francis, in Pennsylvania, were also an important part of Father George's early life as teachers at Nativity School. He remembers there were 13 sisters in the convent who would all come over to visit his family. He said, "I felt so close to the priests and some of the nuns."

Father George's only sister, Agnes, entered the Sisters of the Holy Cross in 1961 where she remained for 15 years. "It became natural for us to be drawn to their way of life", he said, describing the path to a religious vocation for him and his sister.

After attending Nativity School in Washington, D.C., Father George entered Archbishop John Carroll High School graduating in 1959. He then went to Kings College in Pennsylvania graduating in 1963. He went on to Saint Meinrad Seminary in Indiana. He completed his theology studies at the former Trinity Seminary in Washington, D.C.

After being ordained Deacon, he served at Saint Rita Parish in Alexandra, Virginia. He was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Richmond by Bishop Russell on May 11, 1968. His first assignment was at Cathedral of the Sacred Heart as associate pastor. Monsignor Walter Sullivan was the rector. He became rector at the Cathedral and stayed in that role until 1976 when he became pastor of Holy Trinity Parish in Norfolk. In 1981, he was appointed pastor of Saint Bede in Williamsburg where he served for 12 years. He then served as pastor of Saint Augustine Parish in Chesterfield County. In 1994, he became the pastor of Saint Paul's in Richmond where he served for 21 years. Father George retired from Saint Paul's July 31, 2015.

Father George was initiated into the Dooley Division April 3, 1990. In 2015, he was named "Gael of the Year" which is awarded to a Hibernian who has shown great and exemplary contribution to the Dooley Division. Father George's family has had a long connection with the AOH. His father was National Director of the AOH in the 1970's and his mother was a member of LAOH for many years.

Father George, on behalf of The Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Dooley Division, we are honored and humbled by your presence. You are an inspiration and you have made each one of us better people. As they say in Irish, *go raibh míle maith agat* (A thousand thank yous or may you have a thousand good things).

Bishop hopes pope will bring healing to Ireland

DUBLIN — An Irish bishop said he hopes Pope Francis' August visit can help bring healing after a divisive referendum that will pave the way for abortion on demand up to 12 weeks' gestation.

In a May 25 referendum, voters opted by a margin of 66.4 percent to 33.6 percent to remove the right to life of the unborn from the constitution.

Bishop Brendan Leahy of Limerick told Massgoers May 26 that the result "is deeply regrettable and chilling for those of us who voted 'no."

He said "the final result of the referendum is the will of the majority of the people, though not all the people."

"It is a vote, of course, that does not change our position. Our message is one of love: love for all, love for life, for those with us today, for those in the womb," he said.

Referring to Pope Francis' Aug. 25-26 visit, Bishop Leahy said: "In August, we will unite as a family, to renew that sense of family when the World Meeting of Families comes here. We have the privilege of Pope Francis coming, and today I cannot think of his visit being more timely: to come here and remind us of the importance of family, of the love we have of family, of the reality that, yes, families get bruised sometimes, but they should never be broken.

"So we go forward to that moment, we look forward to the healing it will bring and how we will be renewed again in love and care for one another," he said.

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin of Dublin insisted that "the Irish church after the referendum must renew its commitment to support life."

Speaking during a homily at Mass for the ordination to the diaconate of four seminarians at the national seminary in Maynooth, County Kildare, Archbishop Martin insisted that the church is called to be pro-life "not just in words and statements and manifestoes, but to be pro-life in deeds, by being a church which reflects the loving care of Jesus for human life at any stage.

"That loving care includes support to help those women who face enormous challenges and who grapple with very difficult decisions to choose life," he said.
